Stance is published annually in April. The deadline for submissions is mid-December. All papers are anonymously considered by multiple reviewers. Notification of initial decision is in February. All authors receive constructive feedback concerning submissions.

Stance requires first publication right. All other rights reside with the author. Having an international standard serial number [ISSN 1943-1880-print; ISSN 1943-1899-electronic], *Stance* is registered with the U.S. Library of Congress. *Stance* is listed in *The Philosopher's Index* and *PhilPapers*: <https://philpapers.org/pub/4889>.

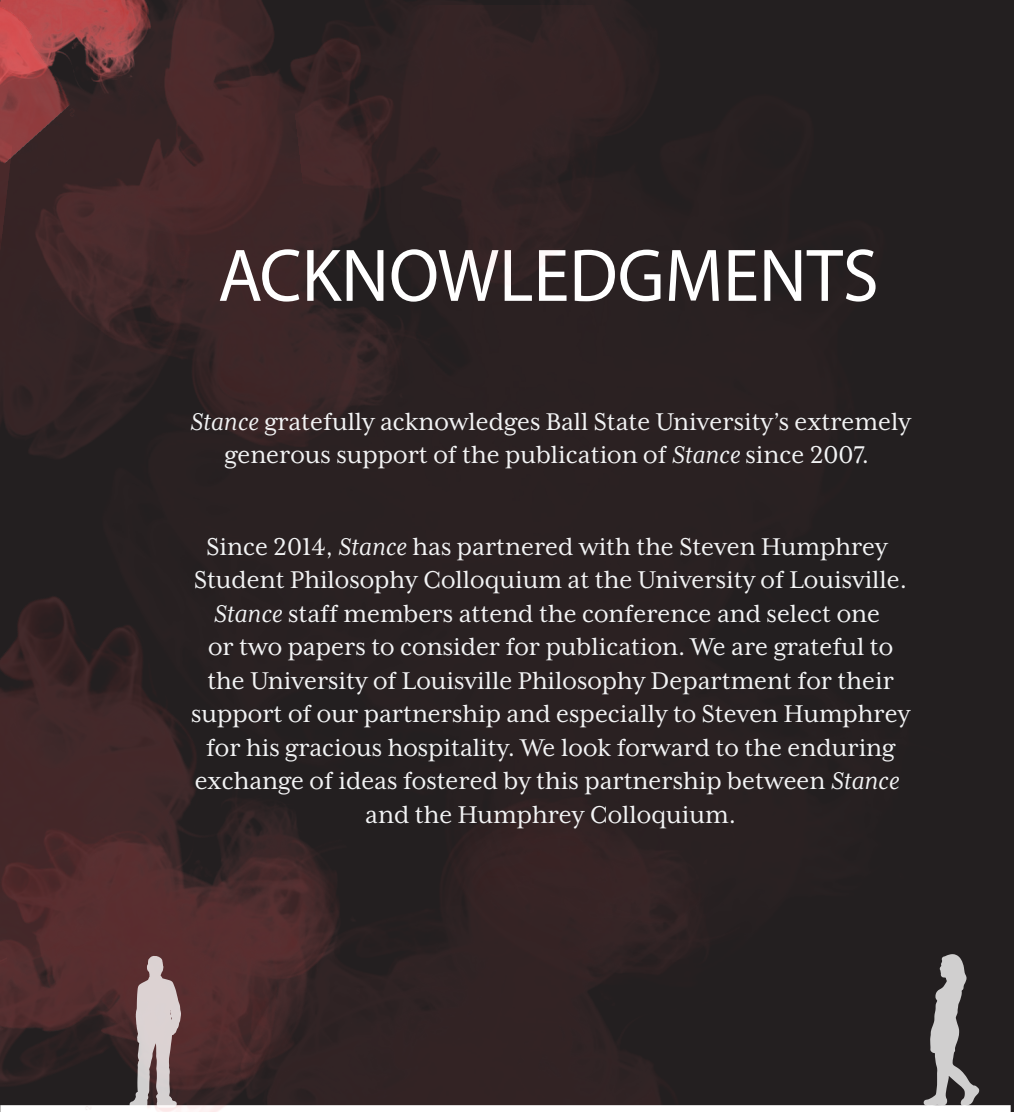
